### RASHTRYA KISHOR SWASTHYA KARYAKRAM (RKSK)/ADOLESCENT HEALTH (AH)

Background: In order to ensure holistic development of adolescent population, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare launched Rashtriya Kishor Swasthya Karyakram (RKSK) on 7th January 2014 to reach out to 253 million adolescents - male and female, rural and urban, married and unmarried, in and out-of-school adolescents with special focus on marginalized and undeserved groups . The programme expands the scope of adolescent health programming in India - from being limited to sexual and reproductive health, it now includes in its ambit nutrition, injuries and violence (including gender based violence), noncommunicable diseases, mental health and substance misuse. The strength of the program is its health promotion approach. It is a paradigm shift from the existing clinic-based services to promotion and prevention and reaching adolescents in their own environment, such as in schools, families and communities. Key drivers of the program are community based interventions like, outreach by counsellors; facility based counselling; Social and Behavior Change Communication; and strengthening of Adolescent Friendly Health Clinics across levels of care.

Adolescent often do not have the autonomy or the agency to make their own decision. RKSK takes cognizance of this and involves parents and community. Focus is on reorganizing the existing public health system in order to meet the service needs of adolescents. Under this a core package of services includes preventive, promotive, curative and counselling services, routine check-ups at primary, secondary and tertiary levels of care is provided regularly to adolescents, married and unmarried, girls and boys during the clinic sessions.

Following that lunching program RKSK has been implementing in Manipur State. The program was implemented through one State Nodal Officer and a State RKSK/AH Consultant. The strategies of RKSK/AH are given below:

#### A. Community based intervention

- Peer Education (PE)
- Quarterly Adolescent Health Day (AHD)
- Weekly Iron Folic Acid Supplementary Programme (WIFS)
- Menstrual Hygiene Scheme (MHS)

#### **B.** Facility based interventions

Strengthening of Adolescent Friendly Health Clinics (AFHC)

#### C. Convergence

- With Health & Family Welfare FP (incl. VHND) RBSK, NACP, National Tobacco Control Programme, National Mental Health Programme, NCDs and IEC.

# D. Social and Behaviour Change Communication with focus on Inter Personal Communication

#### PROGRAMS/ACTIVITIES TAKEN UP DURING THE YEAR 2014 TO 2018

**Dissemination/Meeting/Workshop/Review:** Program have been conducted every year at the State as well as at districts level from 2014-15 to 2017-18 financial years. It is to disseminate and enhance RKSK/AH programme guideline/strategies to all the CMOs, DFWOs, Nodal officers, SPMUs, DPMs, and DCMs.

Convergence meeting with partner departments: Weekly Iron Folic Acid Supplementation (WIFS) program was launched on 10th March, 2014 at Classic Hotel, Imphal. The first State Committee for Adolescent Health (SCAH) was held on 5th Nov, 2014 at Family Welfare Conference Hall. Some of the meeting agendas are: to subsumed the WIFS Advisory Committee to State Adolescent Health Committee (SCAH), to share various programs implemented under RKSK-Health, Education dept, Social Welfare Dept, NYK, YAS, MACS, RIMS & JNIMS. The meeting objective was to form a State Committee for Adolescent Health (SCAH) to work out together in addressing the issues related to adolescent and to avoid overlapping of the activities in the State. On 15th December, 2015 a State Level Convergence Committee meeting was held with Chief Secretary, Manipur in the Chair in his Office Chamber. The Committee after detailed discussion arrived at the following decisions:

- 1. To improve the implementation of WIFS programme, joint monitoring and supportive supervisory visit by the three (30 departments at all level (State, District & Block level)
- 2. Frequent visits to the schools by Block MOs, ANMs are needed especially on the WIFS day i.e. on Monday to convince the base line stakeholders.
- 3. Whenever supply & distribution order from the Health Department is issued, a copy of the order may be marked to the Principal Secretary, Social Welfare and Secretary, Education Department to enhance supply management.
- 4. All the State Nodal Officers of Education (S) & ICDS (Social Welfare) will be invited in the review meeting of WIFS.
- 5. A letter signed jointly by Principal Secretary (Social Welfare), Commissioner (Health & Family Welfare) & Secretary (Education) will be served to all the Deputy Commissioner's of the districts.
- 6. Sample draft letter was examined by all the members present and finalised.

On 28<sup>th</sup> December, 2016, State Committee for Adolescent Health (SCAH) was held in the Chamber of Principal Secretary, Social Welfare.

One Day State Level Convergence Workshop on "Weekly Iron Folic Acid Supplementation Programme (WIFS) was conducted by Medical Directorate at Hotel Imphal under the directive of Minister, Health & Family Welfare. The workshop was participated from Health, Education & Social Welfare departments to address the proper implementation of WIFS program in the State.

#### **FACILITY BASED INTERVENTIONS**

Adolescent Friendly Health Clinics (AFHC): Through Adolescent Friendly Health Clinics (AFHCs), counselling and curative services are provided at primary, secondary and tertiary levels of care on fixed days and fixed time with due referral linkages. Commodities such as Iron & Folic Acid tablets and non-clinical contraceptives are also made available in the clinics for the adolescents. Capacity building of service providers in the six thematic areas is vital for effective and successful implementation of RKSK. AH Division of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has initiated National Level TOTs for Medical Officers, ANMs/LHVs and Counsellors. Further these master trainers trained at national level will undertake state/district level training of service providers at district training sites.

State has identified all the District Hospitals (7 DHs), Community Health Centre (17 CHCs), and Primary Health Centres (45 PHCs) to run the Adolescent Friendly Health Clinics (AFHCs). In the DHs & CHCs the services of AFHCs will be provided every day during OPT hours. One day in a week at PHC for duration of 2 hours from 2 to 4 pm on every Friday.
